

Minutes of the QCGC General Meeting of April 27, 2022

President Pam Williams called the meeting to order at 11:00 a.m.

- Pam welcomed all of the attendees. A brief business meeting followed.
- Treasurer Margie Barber was not present at the meeting; therefore, President Pam Williams gave the Treasurer's report in her absence. Margie's report was from the inception of the club to April 14, 2022. Revenue totals \$775 in dues collected. The revenue also includes \$42.50 being held for member badges. Expenses paid were \$209.26. Revenues over Expenses are \$608.24. The Treasurer's Report was approved by the board at their April 14, 2022 meeting and is on the qcgenealogy.com website.

- Resource Committee Chairman John Gelber informed the members that if they need help with their research, they should contact him as part of the Mentorship Program that he has established. He also said that the club was working on a policy to let members know of advertisements and deals on genealogy websites. He said we want to share the information without endorsing it. The board will be working on developing a policy.
